



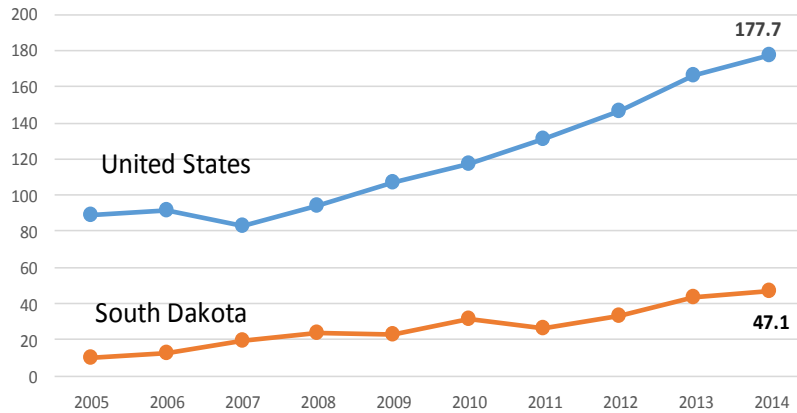

Opioid-Related Emergency Department Visits and Inpatient Stays 2005 — 2014

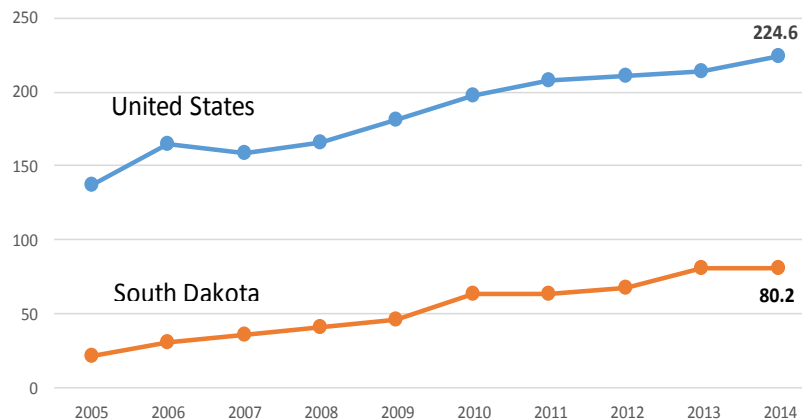
Opioid-related emergency department visits and hospital inpatient stays increased nationally and in South Dakota. In 2014 there were approximately 430 opioid-related emergency department visits in South Dakota for a rate of 47.1 per 100,000. The 2014 national rate was 177.7 per 100,000.

South Dakota's opioid-related hospital inpatient stays has steadily increased since 2005. In 2014 there were over 700 opioid-related hospital inpatient stays in South Dakota. The 2014 South Dakota opioid-related hospital inpatient stays rate was 80.2 per 100,000 compared to a national rate of 224.6 per 100,000.
